Stronger, Healthier, and Better Together

We are not alone in this pandemic crisis as we navigate uncharted waters and as we struggle to deal with the effects of COVID-19. Churches, clergy, and laypersons across North America and around the world are struggling as well. Some are scrambling to implement new technologies related to connecting and giving. Others are advocating for a time of Sabbath rest. Still others are mourning losses of in-person worship and practices that have become traditional and essential to our understanding of worship experiences.

Certainly, times such as these can be the impetus to adapt and adopt practices that perhaps we should have done long before now. However, I invite you to consider these aspects of communicating our faith.

1. Now is the time to consider best practices for keeping our community connected. The majority of our members are primarily 60 and older. Communication with one another is extremely important at this age. And if we want to continue to communicate with each other and include multiple generations, that means we need multiple ways of communicating. Most everyone with an age in double digits has a phone, and mass phone communications have their place. But if we want our members to be engaged with each other and include this group during this crisis, we're going to need to employ social media, text, email, and website. How many ways do we have to reach out to our members and our community? Do we have databases and lists created? Most importantly, are we using them?

2. We all know church is more than buildings, facilities and even worship time. Now is a great opportunity to consider how to tell "the rest of the story" about your church's mission and ministry that goes on 24/7/365. Now if we have a good communication system in place it's going to be easier to tell your story. Are you telling your story to the community *beyond* your faith community? Give our local media good news that might be arising from this crisis – volunteering, giving extra to those whose incomes are affected, inviting, and joining your worship online. It means being clear and enthusiastic about the mission and ministry to which we have been called.

3. Now is the time to consider the ways technology can be an asset in our giving and connecting. We don't have many options to give beyond Sunday morning and we should. Millions of students are now going to school online. Creative teachers have posted videos and created chat rooms and are meeting with students in real time. And some of these digital natives seem to be having some fun in spite of it all, because they are not afraid of this technology. If we are faithful, we will consider opportunities we have with a spirit of abundance that looks for opportunities.

In Hebrews 10:25, we have no way of knowing if the writer could in any way envision today's world when it was written.

We do know that we have been blessed with opportunities to "gather together" in new ways. And we know that Jesus encouraged us to be yeast, salt, and light. Faithfulness embraces all of the ways to multiply and enhance hospitality that invites and engages and leads to Christ.

Hunger Facts

- 1 in 7 individuals in our service area is food insecure, meaning they lack regular access to safe and nutritious food
- More than 1 in 5 children in our service area is food insecure
- 30 percent of the members of households served by the Foodbank are children under the age of 18 years old
- 80 percent of individuals served by the Foodbank have a high school diploma or higher education
- 81 percent of individuals served by the Foodbank report purchasing the cheapest food available, even if they know it's not the healthiest option
- 1 in 5 families served by the Foodbank report having at least one member that has served in the military

Pentecost May 31

The Jewish harvest festival of Pentecost was held fifty days after Passover. On that day, God told the people of Israel, "You shall hold a holy convocation. You shall not do any ordinary work" (Leviticus 23:32). On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was poured out on the disciples. On that day, although the people did no "ordinary work", the Holy Spirit carried out extraordinary work.

The Holy Spirit comes to **help** (John 14:16, John 14:26, Acts 4:31, Romans 8:26), to **guide** (John 16:13, 2 Peter 1:21, Ephesians 6:17), to **glorify** (John 16:14, 2 Timothy 3:15, John 20:31) and to **guarantee** (Ephesians 1:13-14, Romans 8:11, Revelation 2:7).




