LESSONS FROM THE BOOK OF JOB

We have had seven lessons on the Book of Job. These are my reflections on what I have learned. Don Daniels

Purpose: The Book of Job helps us to understand the following: Satan cannot bring financial and physical destruction upon us unless it is by God's permission.

Brief Summary: At the beginning of the book is a scene in heaven where Satan stands before God. God asks Satan, "Have you considered my servant, Job?" (Job 1: 8), and Satan immediately accuses Job, a righteous man, of fearing God only because God had prospered him. "Strike everything he has," Satan says," and he will surely curse you to your face" (Job 1:11). God grants Satan limited permission to put Job to the test. Why do the righteous suffer? This is the question raised after Job loses his family, his wealth, and his health. Job's three friends Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar, come to "comfort" him and to discuss his crushing series of tragedies. They insist his suffering is punishment for sin in his life. Job, though, remains devoted to God through all this and contends that his life has not been one of sin. A fourth man, Elihu, tells Job he needs to humble himself and submit to God's use of trials to purify his life. Finally, Job questions God Himself and learns valuable lessons about the sovereignty of God, His sheer awesomeness, and his need to totally trust in the Lord.

Job is then restored to health, happiness, and prosperity beyond his earlier state.

Practical Application: The Book of Job reminds us that there is a "cosmic conflict" going on behind the scenes that we usually know nothing about. Often we wonder why God allows something, and we question or doubt God's goodness, not being privy or able to see the full picture. The Book of Job teaches us to trust God, not only WHEN we do not understand, but BECAUSE we do not understand. The psalmist tells us, "As for God, His way is perfect" (Psalm 18: 30). If God's ways are "perfect", then we can trust that whatever He does whatever He allows- is perfect.

This may not seem possible to us, but our minds are not God's mind. It is true that we can't expect to understand His mind perfectly, as He reminds us, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55: 8-9). Nevertheless, our responsibility to God is to obey Him, to trust Him, and to submit to His will whether we understand it or not.

Furthermore, as harsh as Job's cries of Job - A Story Of Unlikely Joy by Lisa injustice were at times (EX. 9: 21-24; 10: 13-17; 12: 13-25), he continued to

cry out in his pain to God. He never turned his back on God, but continued to pursue Him, considering God his only hope (Refer to 13: 22-24; 16: 19-21; 19:27; 31:35-37).

When God finally spoke to Job (Chapters 38-41), He neither defended Himself against Job's charges nor explained Job's suffering. To do so would mean that faith must be based on understanding rather than on knowing the God who created all things and maintains order in the cosmos. God demonstrated to Job that He is worthy of man's delighting in Him. Job thus laid aside all of his earlier claims and submitted in faith to the God who rules with wisdom. power, and grace.

Job 42: 5-6, "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes."

God demonstrated His grace by restoring prosperity to His servant in whom He took delight. And Job came to know God better than he ever had before. He is "the Rock-His work is perfect; all His ways are entirely just. A God of truth and without injustice; righteous and upright is He" (Deuteronomy 32: 4).
